What do we require?

In return for an excellent remuneration and support package, we are seeking highly motivated and passionate individual to join our small and growing team of professional staff. Tasks include but are not limited to:

- Providing support and advice to schools in improving their Physical Education, Physical Activity, and School Sport offer.
- Physical education and activity facilitation.
- Delivery of events and activities.
- Leadership, volunteering, and employability skills tutoring.

Please note that this is currently a fixed term placement until 31st July 2020, however the role will continue should funding be secured, and the post holders success will play a key role in achieving this. It is likely we will know continuation probability by May 2020.

Exact hours will be agreed with successful candidates, and are likely to be 37.5 hours per week, 39 weeks per-year (term-time). We are very willing to explore flexible working and reduced hours to suit staff members.

Standard operational hours are 08:00 – 17:00, week days, school term time only.

The aim of the post is to provide high-quality experiences for all participants, and increase transition from school activity; to sustained physical activity within a community setting.

Work will be predominantly with primary aged children (age 5 – 11), with some support of secondary schools; as well as wider community engagement activities.

Job Description

Job Title: Physical Education Specialist (Events)

Salary: £20,000 actual pro-rata (FTE ~£24,000) + pension, expenses, and resources

Hours: Full time (minimum 37.5 hours per-week), school term time, 39 weeks - fixed term until 31st July 2020 **Holiday:** 28 days pro-rata (21 days of holiday pay are factored in to the salary calculation. Employees have official school holiday breaks to use as they wish, with all work undertaken during term-time, unless agreed otherwise by line manager)

Base / Location: Hot-desk at Bramcote College, work across Broxtowe district, remote working as agreed

Responsible To: Physical Activity Network Manager

Responsible For: Event leaders, volunteers, and casual staff

Job Purpose:

- Support schools to increase the quality of their physical education, physical activity, and school sport provision.
- Delivery of events and activities as assigned by the network manager, and events & programmes lead.
- Provide high-quality experiences for all participants, with opportunity to develop transferable life skills, and increase transition from school activity; to sustained physical activity within a community setting.

Duties and Responsibilities:

- Deliver activities including teacher CPD sessions, targeted interventions, playground leaders training, and other initiatives
- Plan and deliver BAS events including personal challenges, intra-school, inter-school, link to county finals, CPD events, workshops, celebration events, and other initiatives.
- Event delivery responsibilities will include extensive operational duties, such as transportation of equipment, and on-day facilitation.
- Follow appropriate monitoring and evaluation processes; assessing impact and value of events and programmes, and adapting based on learning.
- Maintain relationships with PE coordinators, sports coordinators, teaching staff, and other school staff; providing relevant support, advice, and guidance.
- Initiate, grow, and maintain sustainable links with local, regional, and national stakeholders (e.g. community sports clubs, county activity partnership, national governing bodies).
- Ensure adherence to and promotion of appropriate safeguarding policies and procedures across all areas of BAS work, including appropriate risk-assessments for all activities.
- Support a workforce of young leaders, volunteers, and casual staff; ensuring appropriate training, support, and deployment opportunities.
- Maintain an awareness of local, regional, and national sports initiatives, and be able to advise schools and stakeholders as appropriate. Examples include:
 - School Games Mark
 - o PE & School Sport Premium
 - Application of Physical Education, School Sport, and Physical activity within the Ofsted assessment framework
 - o School Sports Action plan and national objectives
- Any other duties deemed necessary by the Physical Activity Network Manager, to achieve the aims and vision of the Broxtowe Active Schools Network.
- Committed to self-development, with a willingness to act on feedback, and undertake professional development opportunities as appropriate.
