Where the facility has not been used previously the site has been visited and deemed low risk to host the event.
Activity surface; - Pot holes - Dog foul - Debris	All participants, staff, and leaders	3	3	9 (MED)	<ul> <li>Visual survey on morning of event.</li> <li>Ongoing assessments</li> <li>Briefing to participants and leaders</li> </ul>		Slightly uneven surface, as is nature of outdoor events.  Rubbish and dog foul unavoidable in public spaces, where the event is taking place on the school site risk of dog foul is low. All playing fields are well maintained. Visual checks will be conducted on the day of the event.

Weather, most likely: - Cold - Wet	Participants, staff, leaders	4	2	8 (MED)	<ul> <li>All attendees informed to wear appropriate clothing and footwear via BAS email to staff.</li> <li>On day assessments as to condition of ground and playing conditions.</li> <li>Ongoing assessment as to conditions.</li> <li>Short sessions no more than a couple of hours ensuring no over-exposure to cold/wet.</li> </ul>	Frequent cold and wet weather during winter/early spring.
Children getting lost.		1	<u>6</u>	6 (LOW)	<ul> <li>Boundaries stated and communicated by staff at the start of the session.</li> <li>Teaching staff are responsible for their group at all times.</li> <li>Participants working in teams, and taking responsibility for own safety promoted.</li> <li>Leaders, volunteers, event staff, and teachers monitoring activity areas.</li> </ul>	No issues reported from previous activities using same area.  Where the facility has not been used previously the site has been visited and deemed low risk to host the event.
Others using the space;  - Abduction or abuse of participants	All participants, particularly young people & vulnerable adults.	1	<u>6</u>	6 (LOW)	<ul> <li>Supervision by leaders, coaches, and school teachers.</li> <li>Event participants and staff to remain within assigned boundaries</li> <li>Children to be escorted to/from toilets.</li> <li>Where school sites are used these will be used during school times and therefore no access to the public permitted at the event.</li> </ul>	No issues recorded at previous events.  Where the facility has not been used previously the site has been visited and deemed low risk to host the event.
